04n_NewPlymouth WaterFront - This is a very interesting place and the reflections are doubly interesting as they are not what is expected. Next time watch the little things such as the top of the people's heads. Maybe cropping in on the right so that area was cropped out would make this a stronger image because it would also eliminate some of the background trees and fence that tend to take my attention away from the main part, the reflection. I like that there has been some thought about taking a subject that is different for this shot. I imagine this could reflect the light too so the clarity and exposure has been well handled. *Merit*



05n_Club Night - I like the fact that this author is thinking outside the square. Using the crystal ball is a great idea I feel. When you are doing something like this though, the subject still needs to make sense and have good composition. Here the main subject is the photographer and the orange takes my attention. Also, the woman in red stands out too. These things matter when an image is being composed. What I do like is that this image is all about the reflection so well done for that. Keep taking images that are different as although they are sometimes harder to take they are more interesting too. **Acceptance**



O6s_Green and Red - The simplicity of the composition and the simplicity of the two colours, that complement each other, are what makes this image for me. The boat has been well placed in the image so that my eyes flow from the boat to the navigation pole. And the neutral background show cases the subjects well. I especially like the way the reflection of the light almost stretches down to the boat and makes that connection between them. This is an image I would be happy to have on my wall. **Honours**



O7s_Sealy Tarn - This is a lovely image of this scene in the high country. The reflection is very clear and the light on the stones bottom left, that I thought at first were clouds, create a lead in to the image. In saying that, I feel the mountain and certainly, the tussocks on the left are in the bright sunshine so are the lightest part of the image and as such attract my attention away from the reflection and keep it on the mountain. It is the reflection that needs to hold pride of place. It is a beautiful image nevertheless. *Merit*



08s_Spoonbills - It is interesting that although the spoonbills are well taken with plenty of detail, it is the reflection that holds my attention. I think it is the movement in the water that facilitates this and makes the reflection more interesting than the actual birds. The birds are well placed in the image on the third line and the composition feels balanced visually. It tells a story. *Highly Commended*.



09i_Pano - The Pano flows well and the reflection holds slightly more weight than the hills because of the different colours in the water that bring it to life. I would have liked a real focal point though. That one hillock does stand out to a certain degree and in the water looks better still. I think this image would benefit from using more contrast especially on that hillock to put some depth into it. **Acceptance**



10i_3791 - I feel this is a panorama and it has been well handled. The scene has a lovely calm feeling. The brightest part is the clouds top left and as such they keep drawing my eye to them and away from the reflection. I feel there is equal weight between the reflection and the land. The horizon line is about half way. Scenes are more interesting usually if that isn't so. In this one I suggest cropping down from the top to remove that lighter clouds and to shift balance to the reflection which I feel this would do. *Merit*




11n_Russel Lights - I like the way the jetty leads in from the left bringing me to the shed. I always enjoy seeing lights reflected in water. The movement of the water has created ripples that give added interest to the reflection in my view. I feel the big dark clouds at the top add nothing to the image. Maybe crop from the top and see how it feels. The exposure has been handled well so that there is a balance between the elements. *Merit*



12s_Godwit Preening - I could watch these birds all day. I am lucky enough to live where they visit, so I often go out in my kayak to watch them. They are delightful birds. The reflection here shows so much detail as the water is very still. I like the way there is slightly more room above/below the head of the bird in the reflection which seems to give the reflection more prominence as does the blue background of the sky reflection. Beautiful details and beautifully handled. *Honours*



13s_Floating Island of the Immortals - What an interesting subject. With this I find it hard to tell which is the reflection and which is the sculpture. Luckily there is that line around it that is subtle but shows me the difference. I feel that if the depth of field had been less, then the trees in the background could have been blurred. This would have made the trees less obvious and the sculpture more. As it is my eyes keep going off to that tree on the right and the cabbage trees in front of it. The reflection has that slight ripple that makes it interesting and not just a copy. **Acceptance.**



14s_Te Anau Marina - The reflection has worked well and as a scene it is a lovely glimpse of the area. I find my eyes following the tree up to the sky and the mountains. This, to me, suggests that the visual weight is there and the reflections are a lesser part. Technically it has been well shot. Compositionally I feel that shifting the frame a bit further to the right, when taking the image, would have eliminated that pole and part of the car and made the cut off of the nearest boat look more choice than accident. I feel that would have made the image stronger. *Merit*
